Report

- Litter levels have shown a statistical increase throughout all seven council wards
- None of these increases reach .50
- The two wards which have shown the least numerical change are Ward 2, and Ward 6
- Ward 3 shows the most significant change, with an increase by nearly half a point (.49)
- Overall, the City of Riverside’s litter mass has statistically increased, but only by a fraction of a point – .30
