How Do I Judge My School?

- Schools will have from <u>April 11th May 6th</u> to produce results for KRCB's Clean Campus Competition. Participation is optional.
- 2. Each participating school will select one or more categories and form a team(s). Each team leader (teacher/staff advisor) will prepare a packet (one for each judge) by completing the *School Report Form* and *Team Report Form* for each team they wish to participate in. All materials can be found on <u>www.krcb.com</u> if a packet was not received via email.
- 3. Each school will be judged in the following four categories; litter prevention, recycling, community greening, and water conservation. It is not required to participate in all four categories. Schools may participate in one or ALL categories. It is possible for a school to win more than one category.
- 4. Each school will select 2 faculty members to judge their school campus. Judges will evaluate each team's efforts using the judging materials provided in this Judging Packet the **week of Monday**, May 9th through Friday, May 13th.
- 5. Each judge should have the following materials provided to them for their school's evaluation:
 - School Report Form
 - Team Report Form(s)
 - Photos (optional, but highly encouraged)
- 6. You will be evaluating your school based on a point system. The judging sheets directly correlate to the *team report forms*. This is why schools must <u>fill out the *Report Form* for each team they wish to be considered for</u> **completely**. Judge your school ONLY within the categories that have filled out reports.
- All judging materials must be completed and submitted to KRCB at <u>ssilva@riverside-chamber.com</u> by Friday, May 20, 2022. The following materials must be submitted to KRCB to be considered for the competition and receive a final review:
 - School and Team Report Form(s)
 - Judging Sheets
 - Photos (optional, but highly encouraged)

Once the judging materials are submitted to KRCB, all participating schools will receive a final evaluation to determine the winners. The final evaluation will be conducted by KRCB Advisory Board Members at the Riverside Chambers of Commerce to determine the winning schools.

- 8. This is a *friendly competition*. Schools are asked to be creative but to also take it seriously. It is encouraged to turn these projects into year-round programs, but it is not required.
- 9. Winners will be notified in August 2022 (new school year) and KRCB will coordinate a day and time with each of the winning schools to deliver and present awards.
